## **From the Pastor: Meeting Anna TUESDAY BIBLE STUDY**

A few weeks ago at our Tuesday Bible study we were so pleased to have Amina Mahmood come visit and speak with us about her Muslim faith. For several weeks now we have been learning about the similarities and differences of the Christian and Muslim faith. We designed some questions for her around how we worship God or Allah, how we interpret scripture of the bible and the Qur'an, the place of war or violence in our faiths and the role of women in places of leadership or in worship. In our study of Islam, which was purchased from the **Thoughtful Christian** website, each member of our study group is in harmony with the following perspective:

***“No argument is needed for the importance of understanding Islam. That great religion occupies the attention of the world as never before in modern times. The Thoughtful Christian seeks to get behind the sensational headlines, the biased stereotypes, and the polemics that so often characterize the treatment of Islam in the media. A Christian perspective on the subject will take into account what the people of Islam say about their faith and will seek humbly to understand how believers in Christianity and believers in Islam can best relate to one another.”***

So we asked Amina to come and join us.

Amina is an acquaintance of Ian Leet's. They know each other from serving on the University of Albany Interfaith Chapel Board. She is a psychologist who is teaching at SUNY Albany and she attends weekly prayers/worship at a mosque in Schenectady, Masjid Ummat An-Nabwi (also known as the Islamic Center of the Capital District).

She was born in Pakistan and has lived in many countries, such as Saudi Arabia, Europe and eventually here in USA for the past 20 years. Her parents are both educators and enjoy full careers teaching in both Pakistan and neighboring countries. Amina is “30 something”, a warm and engaging person who was very respectful and kind to us. She came and gave very thoughtful answers to our questions such as: Could you tell us about your daily prayers? What do Muslim's believe about Jesus Christ and other OT prophets, What is jihad, What of groups like ISIS?

Amina was pleased to tell us some important facts that have been commonly distorted in our media. She told us that her definition of jihad is the personal process of coming to peace within oneself, confronting our own personal conflict between good and evil. In Arabic, the word jihād is a noun meaning the act of "striving, applying oneself, struggling, persevering". For people of her faith this word does not mean attack of others in defense of their faith. Amina pointed out that war or extremist attack by terrorist fundamentalists groups make up a very small percentage of the Muslim population. Some of the Muslim faith might agree with “just war” in defense of one's own life, but violent agendas of groups such as ISIS or the Taliban

are highly political and motivated for reasons that are most often not religious at all. People of her faith are appalled and mortified by groups like this and do not in any way support their actions. We lamented with Amina that there is such misperception right now in USA and increasing racism against her people or of people who look like they are from near eastern countries.

We learned that in her faith loving others and God is of the highest value and we share almost all of the same commandments. We were struck by the beauty and discipline of daily prayers as she described this foundational practice. She also clarified that women, especially in larger cities like Islamabad (capital of Pakistan) enjoy working and dress as women do in the USA. She also told us that for most women to wear the traditional naqab (veil) is done out of a woman's personal decision to express herself. Pressure to wear clothing such as this is rare in most Muslim communities. She told us in rural areas there can be more conservative practices that we typically encounter in the books we read or news. Amina is very concerned at how those of the Muslim faith are being betrayed in our country and she told us some very sad stories of people being persecuted and murdered and that these stories are not being seen on our news.

We parted in the joy of having met one another. Amina gave us a great gift of her time and thoughtful preparation. We pray for her and others of the Muslim faith that racism against them and others of color in our country will be diminished and someday soon will be no more. There is so much to learn and what a joy for us to have made a new friend, and a friend of such deep faith and commitment to God. She left us a reading list (see below) that she believes will be very helpful to our congregations.
