Dear Friends,

During the month of November we will mark several important events in the life of our congregation.

Sunday, November 1, is All Saints, a day in which we remember and give thanks for the saints who have gone before us. We'll look both to the past and to the future, remembering with thanksgiving and rejoicing in hope. It's a time to remember the particular gifts and unique witness of some of the people who have touched our lives and the life of our congregation. We miss them, and there is sorrow in that. We hope that several of the contractors, architects and trades people will also be present in worship and we will have opportunity to thank them during a special reception after the service.

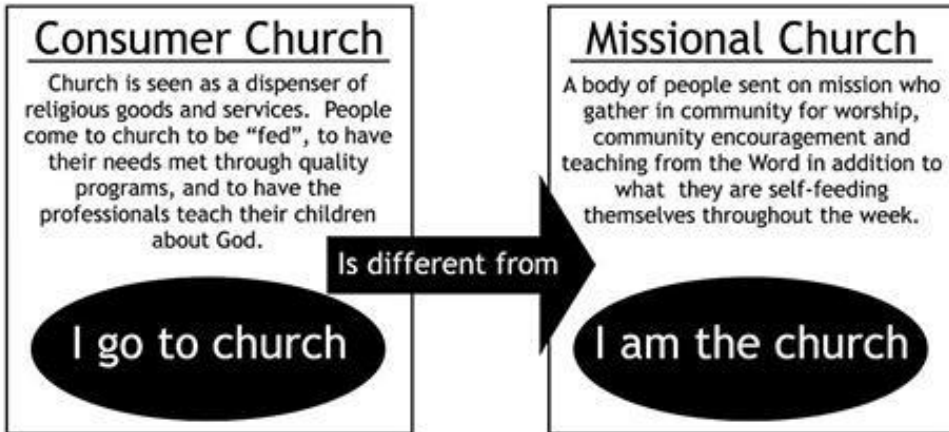

## Growing Green - Caring for Creation



- Every ton of recycled office paper saves 380 gallons of oil.

### **It's Overflow Shelter Dinner time again- Can you help?**

The Emergency Overflow Shelter at First Lutheran Church in Albany, sponsored by the Capital Area Council of Churches, is a “shelter of last resort” when other shelters are full or for those not be eligible for other shelters because of addictions or mental health issues. It is open during the winter months and turns nobody away. Since 2008 First Church has been providing two meals a month for the Shelter.

Our first dinners of the season are December 4th (Italian dishes) and December 18th (Chili). We need your help.
