Prayer of Confession Inspired by a prayer from the Presbyterian Church USA

Most holy and merciful God, like those who fast in convenient ways, we condemn racial injustice with our words, and yet so many of us cling to the privileges derived from racism. Like living with the lights turned off, we complicitly live in and maintain systems of oppression, causing the hopes and dreams of another generation to be deferred. Holy Spirit, teach us true fasting, and cut off our attachments to those things that lead to the oppression of our neighbors and ourselves; turn on the lights in our world to expose systems of oppression, and empower us to live lives that are anti-racist and justice oriented.

Silence

Assurance of Pardon From Isaiah 58, True Fasting Leads to The Light of Dawn

"Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the cords of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke? Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them, and not to hide yourself from your own kin? [When this is your fast], then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your healing shall spring up quickly."

Leader: The peace of Christ be with you.

Touch your thumb to the tip of your ring finger, and wave to one another. This hand-sign makes Christ's gesture of blessing in a lot of iconography in the Orthodox Tradition.

Sermon Text

John 2:1-1

On the third day, there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."

Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them,

"Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now."

Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

Leader: The Gospel of the Lord. **People: Praise to you, O Christ!**




