They learned this two and a half years after the Emancipation Proclamation. For over 150 years, this moment has been celebrated as Juneteenth, highlighting history, art and culture, as we honor the day that slavery ended in the U.S.. In 2021, Juneteenth became an official federal holiday in the United States. It is also known as Emancipation Day, Freedom Day, and Juneteenth National Independence Day. As we observe Juneteenth, let us lift up a prayer that we progress everyday toward justice, understanding and acceptance of one another. May the Lord lead us to see the value that he has embroidered into each one of us and learn to be joyful in the discovery of those gifts.
