

- Prayer of Confession Prayer for Refugee Sunday by the Rev. Dr. Tim TenClay, longtime RCA missionary and now minister at Community Reformed Church at Manhasset, New York
 - Leader: Let us pray. Ever merciful God, you said "Let us make humankind in our own image." (Genesis 1:26)
 - People: Forgive us, we pray, for the times we have only recognized your image in those who look, think, and act like us.
 - L: You said "Six days you shall labor and do all your work. But the seventh day is a sabbath to the LORD your God; you shall not do any work—you, your son or your daughter, your male or female slave, your livestock, or the alien resident in your towns." (Exodus 20:9-10)
 - P: Forgive us, we pray, for the times we have imagined ourselves too important to rest and treated others as unworthy of time off.

- L: You said "the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." (Galatians 5:22)
- P: Forgive us, we pray, for the times we have hated, brooded, divided, hurried, been cruel, stingy, disloyal, harsh, and self-indulgent...

World Refugee Day is June 20. World Refugee Day offers us an opportunity to build empathy and understanding for the plight of refugees, to recognize their resilience, to pray for displaced people and their homelands, and to take time to discern how God is calling us, as Christ followers, to provide compassionate care for refugees and other displaced people. 
