From the Pastor

Dear Friends,

“Tell me a Jesus story, Grampy.” So I begin, “Once there was a man who did such amazing things and told such wonderful stories. One day after teaching and healing people all day he was very tired so he and his friends got in a boat to go to the other side of the lake. Jesus was so tired he soon fell asleep. Then the wind began to blow, the waves started splashing in the boat. Jesus’ friends pulled hard on the oars but the storm was getting stronger and they were afraid....” My three year old granddaughter has heard the story before but never seems to tire of hearing it again.

Recently several of us who participated in an interfaith travel seminar to Israel and Palestine gave a presentation about the trip. Each of us shared an experience from the trip and offered reflections on what we had seen and heard. Raed, a Palestinian man, was in the audience. After we had finished our presentation he got up and spoke: “When people come to visit us in Palestine we tell them our stories. We tell them what life is like for us here, how hard it is to live under military occupation, and I often wonder: What happens to our stories? Where do they go? Now I know. You have told our story so beautifully. Thank you.”

He was not asking us to change the situation. He was not urging us to work to end the occupation or to make his life easier. He was simply grateful to know that his story had been heard and shared, to know that his story had gone somewhere and that he was not forgotten.


Our Sunday morning service may be found anytime at www.firstchurchinalbany.org.

Each of us has a story. Each of us has a story that needs to be told and heard and honored. We may not expect anyone to take away our pain or to fix what is broken, but we deserve to be heard. We deserve to know that our story is valued, that our life matters, and that we are not forgotten.

In the church we tell 'Jesus stories,' stories about a man who stilled the storm, fed the hungry, healed the sick, suffered and died and rose from the dead. We also need to tell our own stories and to hear and honor each other's stories. Your story is important; it deserves to be heard. In the process of sharing our stories we learn things about ourselves, and often discover connections between our own story and the Jesus story, the story of a man who did such amazing things.

I'm delighted when my granddaughter asks me to tell her the stories of Jesus. I'm also honored when some asks, "Tell me *your* story."

He shared with her that his congregation was returning to Children and Worship after setting this program aside for some time. They will be starting the C&W again soon because Nathan said “[we] have discovered that the children who went through C & W have a better biblical literacy than those students who do not experience it.”

As we know having a deeper understanding of scripture is the glue and the passion of Christian life. There is endless wisdom and

guidance that we can only grasp in small ways each time we encounter scripture. It is the sustenance of life and can guide us to full life. Biblical literacy is essential to living well.

As we have often reminded our own congregation and ourselves, this is not Sunday School but it is **Worship**. Here children hear the Word, as Rev. Nathan Busker’s understands, they sing, pray, express their understanding of the Word, and have a Feast once a month (learning about the practice of Communion).

This past year in our 3-7 year old Worship Program we had 5 children actively participate. In the 8-12 year old Worship Program we had an average of 3 regular participants. Our Storytellers are: Sara Bonam Welge, Kim Gattie, Adrienne Pagerey, Marilyn Paarlberg and Dorey Foster. Our greeters are Imani Brewer, Terry Gattie, Sue Hunter, Kaitlyn Bliss, and Norma McClement.

We have been truly blessed that these members guided our children each Sunday. We want to warmly thank them for their love for the children, and their understanding that they are serving a ministry, and participating in worship of our Almighty and Loving God. We thank them for stepping forward in many ways.

Special 375th Commemorative Service – August 20, 2017

Three hundred and seventy five years ago, on August 17, 1642, Rev. Johannes Megapolensis, preached his first sermon in what was then the Patroonship of Rensselaerswijck. We have traditionally marked this date as the founding date of the First Church in Albany.

On August 20, 2017, the Sunday nearest the Three Hundred Seventy Fifth Anniversary of that event, First Church is planning a special service to commemorate that founding. We are honored to invite back to the pulpit for that special day, Rev. Kenneth Bradsell, co-pastor here from 1981 – 1984. Ken has enthusiastically agreed to come back and preach. Music will be provided by the Nat Phipps Jazz Trio. The service will be a combined service at 10 am, and there will be no Drive-in that day. This will be followed by an all church picnic in Clee Park and the parking lot just outside the office doors. In case of bad weather, we'll just do it all inside. Mark the date on your calendar and plan to join us.

Special Heritage Service and Luncheon – October 29, 2017

As the final event in our year-long celebration of our Three Hundredth Seventy Fifth Anniversary, we will be having a grand service on Reformation Sunday, October 28, 2107. The Rev.
