The Sunday of the Passion

The liturgy for the first day of Holy Week is in two parts. It begins with a procession with palms as a dramatic prelude. The service then moves to a celebration of the Passion of Jesus Christ, a highlight of which is the reading of the passion account in one of the Gospels. As a prelude to the reading of the passion, the procession with palms provides for an appropriate outburst of joy which does not lose sight of the solemn goal of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. He rides on to die. The somberness of the passion, which is the focus of Holy Week, is thus framed by the joy of the preparatory procession and by the greater joy of Easter which is its purpose and culmination.

We welcome all who gather to worship God this morning, especially visitors and friends from near and far. Please sign our guest book or complete a visitor's card (found in the pew rack) and place it in the offering plate. There is an elevator in our building, which makes every floor accessible. Please join us for refreshments and conversation downstairs after worship.
