FROM THE INTERIM PASTOR

*“To everything there is a season,
and a time for every matter under heaven.”
~ Ecclesiastes 3.1*

Dear Friends,

You may be familiar with the call-and-response saying that speaks the truth of our faith: “God is good – all the time! All the time, God is good!” In every season, God has been sharing goodness within the life of First Church.

On a rainy May Sunday, Drive-in worship kicked off another year of its inventive way to pray, preach and praise God. Our music and preaching pour out not only over the people in cars gathered in the parking lot, but also into the park and the streets surrounding the church, sharing the good news that God is good, all the time.

On Heritage Sunday, we welcomed members and visitors for a celebration of 376 years of ministry in the city of Albany. We sang hymns brought to this place from the Netherlands as well as the hymn commissioned for last year’s anniversary. With the children we learned about one of the precious silver chalices used in the 17th century by this church. We received three new members into the life of the congregation (see pages 5 & 6.) We departed charged by words adapted from St. Augustine to appreciate the foundation the past has laid for us, to receive who we are, and to be who we are called to be. All the time, God is good.

On Pentecost, the Spirit filled the sanctuary with language, word and song, then led us into a time of fellowship and meeting. New members were elected to Consistory. Together we continued to share our thoughts to help create the church profile. God is good!

Children and Worship has wrapped up another year of wondering and worship with the congregation’s children. We give thanks to all who have supported this program, as leaders and greeters, and for the children and families of the church. God is good!

A season of moral witness has begun and continues into June with the Poor People’s Campaign. First Church has offered, if needed, to host visitors from out of town who come to pray and sing and advocate for the gap to narrow between rich and poor, for our energy to be directed to lift up the vulnerable rather than blame them, for our efforts to focus on doing all we can to restore God’s creation. God is good. Will God’s people also be?

As we head into the summer season, some of us will be in and out of church for vacation or summer camps. But here at the First Church in Albany, we will still gather as people of God: to worship in the park on June 24, and - come July and August - to grow the Drive-in community, hold worship in James Chapel (with air-conditioning!), host the FOCUS churches on July 1, and serve hotdogs on Thursdays. The Search Committee to be announced soon will embark on their important work. We'll be planning next year's program to support our faith journeys. And God will be wherever we are: supporting, encouraging, challenging, comforting, leading us forward. Because God is good, all the time.

HISTORIC ALBANY FOUNDATION TOUR VISIT

Thirty-five visitors from several different states toured First Church on Saturday, May 5, the last stop on a three-hour walking tour of Albany's historic architecture. The tour was sponsored by the Historic Albany Foundation for members of the National Preservation Trust. Tom Allison, Ian Leet, Shirley Bone, and Jim Folts set up displays, including the contracts for the 1715 stone church and the 1796 building (still our church home), drawings by architect Philip Hooker, photographs showing changes to our church over the decades, and color images of the towers renovation in 2012-14. Also displayed were documents from the memorial services for President George Washington in 1800 and Alexander Hamilton in 1804.

DRIVE-IN

Drive-In worship services began at 9 a.m. on May 6th and will continue each Sunday through the first Sunday in September. Worshippers gather in the Sheridan Avenue parking lot and in Clee Park for a half hour worship service led from the outdoor pulpit. If you arrive before 9:30 a.m. for the Sanctuary Service, please park in the Orange Street Lot or in the large lot against the wall that borders North Pearl Street. The last Sunday in June both the Sanctuary and Drive-In will gather in Clee Park at 10:00 am for worship. There will be no separate Drive-In worship on that day.

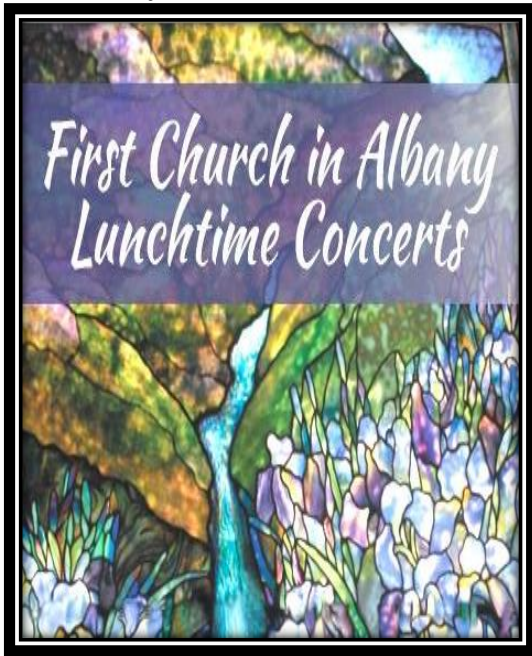
The First Church Readers's will meet June 3rd after worship to discuss – *Best to Laugh: A Novel* by Lorna Landvik.

CHILDREN AND WORSHIP

On Sunday May 13th we had our final worship together for this year since we do not meet during the summer months. This would be a great opportunity to learn and share stories with other members of the Church. The cost of the weekend will be \$160 per person, which includes food and lodging. Scholarships are available.

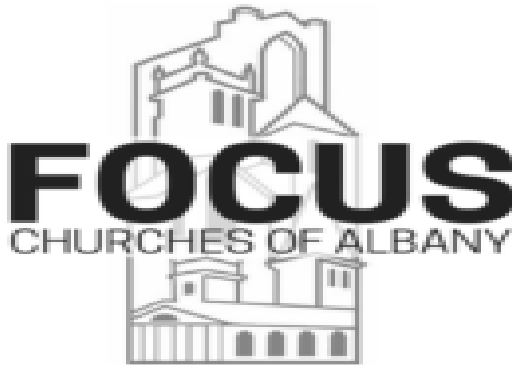

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE FOOD PANTRY?

In April, the First Church Food Pantry was open nine days, providing food for neighbors, members and friends. Each household is able to come to the pantry twice a month, and receives nine meals per household member based on HPNAP (Hunger Prevention & Nutrition Assistance Program) guidelines. Household members are categorized as Infants (age 0-3), Children (4-17), Adults (18-64) and Seniors (65+). This month our volunteers packed food for 156 households, which included one infant, 44 children, 156 adults and 31 seniors.

We are grateful to all our volunteers, our staff for offering food not only for the body, but for the spirit through their kindness. We are blessed by the food provided by the Food Bank and by members of Bethany Reformed Church – and by YOU.
