

Psalter Antiphonal Reading of Psalm 29 (Message Translation)

- One: Bravo, God, bravo! Gods and all angels shout, "Encore!"
- All: In awe before the glory, in awe before God's visible power. Stand at attention! Dress your best to honor him!
- One: God thunders across the waters, Brilliant; his voice and his face, streaming brightness—God, across the flood waters.

All: God's thunder tympanic, God's thunder symphonic.

One: God's thunder smashes cedars, God topples the northern cedars.

- All: The mountain ranges skip like spring colts, The high ridges jump like wild kid goats.
- One: God's thunder spits fire. God thunders, the wilderness quakes; He makes the desert of Kadesh shake. God's thunder sets the oak trees dancing. A wild dance, whirling; the pelting rain strips their branches.
- All: We fall to our knees—we call out, "Glory!" Above the floodwaters is God's throne from which his power flows, from which he rules the world.

One: God makes his people strong. God gives his people peace.

Gospel Reading Matthew 3:13-17

Before Jesus begins his ministry, he is baptized by John, touched by the Holy Spirit, and identified publicly as the child of God.

Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. John would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now, for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness." Then he consented. And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw God's Spirit descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from the heavens said, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased."

One: The Gospel of the Lord. All: Praise to you, O Christ!

Silent Reflection

Reaffirmation of Our Baptismal Covenant

One: Siblings in Christ, through the Sacrament of Baptism we have been joined into Christ's holy church.

All: We share in the story of God's mighty acts of salvation and we receive new birth through water and the Spirit.

One: These are the gifts of God, offered freely to all.

All: Let us renew the covenant declared at our baptism, acknowledging what God is doing in, through, and for us.

All are invited to rise in body or in spirit and are invited to circle the font if able

One: God be with you.

All: And also with you.

One: Let us give thanks to God.

All: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Holy One, we thank you for the gift of water.

Over it, your Spirit hovered at the creation of the world

- Through it, you led the children of Israel out of bondage and into the Promised Land.
- In the fullness of time, you sent Jesus, who was nurtured in the water of Mary's womb.

And in it, Jesus was baptized and recognized as your beloved child.

With these words, the leader reaches into the water and allows it to pour back into the basin

We thank you for the water of Baptism. In it, we are buried, sharing in Christ's death. By it, we share also in Christ's resurrection. Through it, we are reborn by the power of the Holy Spirit as your children.

All gathered extend their hands into or over the water, repeating after the leader

Now bless this water, we pray, by the power of your Holy Spirit. May it remind us that we have been cleansed from sin and are born again into new life. May it enliven us to remain faithful until we are united with you in the life to come. Amen.



The Affirmation of Unity

One: Let us affirm the unity that comes from our baptism into Christ.

- All: We come out of many traditions. We have confessed many understandings of Baptism: sacrament, symbol, and sign. Some of us were baptized before we remember. Others only later when we said, "I believe."
- One: Whether we were immersed, poured upon, or sprinkled, it is your action, Gracious God, that defines our baptism.


All: Having put off the old nature, we have been clothed with Christ.

One: There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male or female. For we are all one in Christ Jesus—your children through faith, heirs to the promise. Old things have passed away.

All: Behold, you make all things new.

Guide us to serve as living witnesses for the unity of the body of Christ through participation in the Capital Area Council of Churches Ecumenical Witnesses of Baptism program.




Notes:
