People: and therefore we have been brought from death to life.


Leader: Let us set our hearts on this:

Assurance of Pardon & Fulfillment of the Law

Friends of Christ, in our scripture passage today, we see how the resurrected Jesus appeared to His friends, instructed them to change, and even made breakfast for them so that they might be filled with hope. Today, we can take comfort in the fact that this same resurrected Jesus is with us here and now, calling us to change and promising to provide us with all that we need. Accept his instructions and provisions, and be changed.

*Passing the Peace:



Leader: The peace of Christ be with you.

People: And also with you.

Leader: Let us greet one another with a hand-sign of peace.

Touch your thumb to the tip of your ring finger, and wave to one another. This hand-sign makes Christ's gesture of blessing in a lot of iconography in the Orthodox Tradition.

Sermon Text John 21:1-14

After these things Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias, and he showed himself in this way. Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We will go with you." They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.


Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach, but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, you have no fish, have you?" They answered him, "No." He said to them, "Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his outer garment, for he had taken it off, and jumped into the sea. But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, only about a hundred yards off.

When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you have just caught." So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred fifty-three of them, and though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

Leader: The Gospel of the Lord. **People: Praise to you, O Christ!**

Sermon: "Come and have breakfast."

A Prayer of Blessing on the Word



This Easter text, first in French and later in English, was written to fit the music, a chorus created for Handel's oratorio *Joshua* and moved to *Judas Maccabeus* in 1751. It grew widely popular following its use at the First Assembly of the World Council of Churches in 1948.

Profession of Faith §38 of *Our World Belongs To God, a Contemporary Testimony of the CRCNA*

In the Lord's Supper, Christ offers his own crucified body and shed blood to his people, assuring them a share in his death and resurrection.

By the Holy Spirit, he feeds us with his resurrection life and binds us to each other as we share one loaf and cup.

We receive this food gladly, believing, as we eat, that Jesus is our life-giving food and drink and that he will come again to call us to the wedding feast of the Lamb.
