When?: Sunday, June 11th (Marching starts at 11:45, but come earlier!)

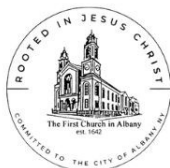
Where?: Marching starts on State St. and ends in Washington Park.
