## **From Pastor Mashona...**

Dear FCIA Friends and Family,

On November 1, 2020, I celebrated my one-year anniversary with all of you at First Church in Albany! It has been quite a year! On Sunday, November 1, 2020, I looked out from the beloved outdoor pulpit at a parking lot filled with cars and one brave woman standing by the fence, in the cold weather.

As worshipers honked their horns and another woman of Zion got out of her car with shouts of acclamation, I was filled with awe! In the face of wind, rain, and cold we have held worship outside each week since Sunday, March 22, 2020. I have only preached behind the sacred desk inside the sanctuary 18 times. On Sunday, November 1, 2020, I realized that the outdoor pulpit with floor and side window stained by paintballs from Halloween nights revelry is where I have preached. This parking lot is where we have faithfully gathered and even grown in Sunday morning worship attendance.

In the face of layers of challenge, we as a people have learned to pivot and let our light shine for the community where our historic building stands.

Thank you for serving during what will go down in history as the best and the worst of

times. A year ago, we began a Centering Prayer ministry that continues to gather each Wednesday at noon. As a pastor, it filled my heart with joy when you kept gathering and praying while I took a vacation. We have continued to gather for worship, in the face of two pandemics: COVID and cries for justice. Even after neighborhood fires and protests, we let our light shine. We joined the protests and prayer vigils. We cried on the sidewalks with others who mourned. We kept the lines of communication with those from both sides of the aisles. We invited our young adults to speak from their perspectives. When other businesses boarded up, we chose to remain open and shine the light. We still preached the gospel outside and encouraged our neighbors to hold on for a brighter day. It wasn't easy or always smooth. Now, I reflect with laughter at the times we lost sound, ZOOM and conference call connections, or battery power. Do you remember the Sunday the passer-by tried to climb up behind me in the outdoor pulpit... while I was in the middle of preaching!!!!

It has been an epic ride and I await to see what else God will do in 2021. I have a feeling that everything is going to be better than alright. I've gotta feeling that the light of FCIA is going to burn even brighter. Please pray for me

and my family as I pray for you. Please pray that our community of faith grow and serve effectively in this coming season of more change and challenge. Pray that when the sky gets dark, FCIA will always share the light of God!

A song from my childhood sums it up for me: *I'm looking for a miracle. I expect the impossible. The sky is the limit for what we can have! Believe and receive it. God will be performing, today!*

We will be moving indoors on December 6th. Here is what you need to know:

We will give anyone who wants to utilize the pantry some Thanksgiving items and hand out the gift cards to FCIA guests that live in our catchment area.

This option would save time and volunteers from making separate bags, opening up a separate day and also having guests "sign up" for Thanksgiving. The gift cards will be \$10.00 per household.

Again, only mail checks and do not purchase gift cards.

### Cake Mixes for Thanksgiving baskets:

The Food Pantry is collecting boxed cake mixes and icing for the Thanksgiving baskets (any flavor). These can be dropped off at the church Monday through Thursday between 10:00 AM – 2:00 PM. They will also be collected at the Sunday service.
